We will emphasize practical approaches to screening and intervention in this new era of modulator therapy. Cases will cover the life span from childhood through adulthood.

PLENARY

The Plenary sessions, lasting 90 minutes, comprise keynote lectures of experts in the field.

SYMPOSIA

The sessions, lasting 90 minutes, comprise 3 to 4 lectures by experts in the field covered by the symposium and specifically in the topic presented. Each presentation is followed by discussion time when all attendees are invited to ask questions about/discuss the presentation.

WORKSHOPS

The sessions, lasting 90 minutes, comprise oral presentations of scientific work as outlined in the abstracts. The moderators of the workshop, experts in the field covered by the workshop, will introduce the different presentations and facilitate the discussion time when all attendees are invited to ask questions about/discuss the presentation.

CASE STUDIES

Informative cases related to diagnosis or management of cystic fibrosis will be presented and discussed. A panel of experts in the field facilitate the discussion and foster exchange of information or discuss treatment possibilities based on their expertise and knowledge of the latest scientific publications.

The Meet the Experts sessions are small interactive sessions led by experts to stimulate discussion, answer questions and offer advice. The format encourages a more personal approach to learning. Each of the expert sessions is limited to 50 participants.

These are moderated thematic sessions, during which ePosters will be presented on a 50-inch flat screen.



Information About the Conference

ARRIVAL BY PLANE

Milan is served by three airports: Linate, Malpensa and Bergamo Orio al Serio.

Linate:

The airport is linked to the city centre by metro line M4.

Malpensa:

You can reach the city centre with the Malpensa Express train. Various bus companies also serve the route.

Bergamo Orio al Serio:

You can reach Milan by bus shuttle services run by various companies.



Milan can be reached from the main Italian and European cities by the Trenitalia and Italo highspeed trains.

Bikes are an eco-friendly and practical means of travelling around the city. Milan offers approx. 144 kilometres of cycle paths and lanes over a completely flat area for bicycle lovers.

Bike Sharing is available both with fixed pickup & drop-off bicycle stations with BIKEMI, and with free floating bicycles i.e., when the bikes can be picked up via the app and parked along the roadside where there are no reserved parking areas or restrictions. Various companies offer this service.
