The course will involve developing a deeper understanding of the theory and application of evidence-based treatments; this will include different kinds of approaches for decision-making.

Such approaches include Motivational Interviewing, Strengths Based Approach, Acceptance and Commitment Therapy and more. After introducing the theory, we will share good practice examples using case studies and consider implementation through small discussions groups. The course will focus on people with CF discussing all ages from childhood to adulthood, including transition, developmental needs and life challenges.

The 47th edition of the ECFS Conference will take place in Glasgow. Glasgow is Scotland's cultural powerhouse with its museums and galleries, its legendary music scene with many iconic venues, its Victorian architecture and over 90 parks and gardens.

In the UK, Glasgow has the largest academic community outside London and conducts world leading research in the fields of life sciences, engineering, science and technology. Glasgow boasts world-renowned universities including the ancient University of Glasgow founded in 1451, where cutting edge research facilities sit side by side with historical buildings, and whose alumni include John Logie Baird the inventor of television, Sir William Macewen who conducted the world's first bone graft and successful removal of a brain tumour, and Dame Jocelyn Bell Burnell the world-famous astrophysicist.

The Scottish Event Campus where our conference will be held can host events up to 10,000 participants. It is located on the outskirts of Glasgow and is within walking distance of the city centre. The Clyde Auditorium, where our plenary sessions will be held, is a stunning piece of architecture, designed by Sir Norman Foster, and situated beside the river Clyde. It is often referred to by Glaswegians as 'the Armadillo'.

ARRIVAL BY PLANE

Glasgow has 3 international airports nearby, with connections across the UK and the world:

Glasgow Airport is the closest airport to the city centre. Catch the express bus service from outside the terminal and arrive in Glasgow in around 15 minutes. Glasgow Prestwick Airport is 32 miles (51km) from Glasgow. It is very accessible with train and bus services to the city centre.

Edinburgh Airport is 39 miles (63km) from Glasgow. There is a direct bus service from the airport to Glasgow's Buchanan Bus Station which takes around 1 hour.


Band
