The aim of EPSIG is to provide education and support for CF psychosocial professionals and teams by sharing good practice, research and information in a friendly and supportive environment. Understanding and addressing psychosocial factors is important in helping people with CF and their relatives achieve the best possible health outcomes. In part, the psychosocial role is to deliver a psychological and social work service to the MDT.

It is also essential to cooperate with other ECFS special interest groups and the Mental Health Working Group to collaborate in activities aimed at improving the care of patients with CF and their families.

The described goals are systematically achieved by sharing the experience of group members, organizing meetings, workshops and courses.

The main activity of the group takes place during the annual ECFS conferences, during which members organize and actively participate in such activities as: Pre-conference ECFS Psychosocial Special Interest Group Meetings, Pre-conference Short Courses, Interactive sessions "Tomorrow lounge".

In addition to the activities during the annual conference, EPSIG co-organized the ECFS Lunchtime webinars series

The EPSIG Committee meets regularly online on a monthly basis to organise the EPSIG pre conference meeting and course, discuss the group's goals and to plan future activities.

The EPSIG comprises of around 60 psychosocial professional members.



The EPSIG committee have organised the following activities during the digital 44th European Cystic Fibrosis Conference:

EPSIG pre-conference meeting "Different perspectives on resilience" on 9th June 2021.

Pre-Conference Short Course - Power Threat Meaning Framework *on* 8th June, in collaboration with the MH WG

Interactive session "Tomorrow lounge" focused on relationship between patients/families and the MDT members.

The EPSIG and MH WG have organized a series of four lunchtime webinars for the CF MDT. The topics concerned broadly understood areas of care in context of mental health aspects and psychosocial care. The aim was to present the cooperation of various specialists in the context of creating the best practices in MDT. Additionally, the online format allowed for the participation of clinicians from many regions (participants from 34 countries registered). The topics of organised webinars:

- A basic introduction for allied health professionals into CFTR modulators 27th of October 2021
- Pain in CF 15th of December 2021
- Past, present and future psychosocial care in CF 23th of February 2022
- Trauma and CF 27th of April 2022

- Interactive session "Tomorrow lounge" titled What psychosocial outcome measures are being used/found useful in CF?

The CF lunchtime webinar series organised jointly with MH WG is planned to be continued next year.
