Abstract Submission Style Guide

General Guidelines



- Use British English only (for more details, please refer to: <u>https://en.oxforddictionaries.com/spelling/british-and-spelling</u>)
- Use full name in the first instance e.g. cystic fibrosis (CF)
- Do not use contractions e.g. can't or don't
- Trademarked names can **only** be used in the abstract body (do not use in the abstract title)
 - Use the trademark or registered sign (®,TM)
- The ampersand symbol (&) can **only** be used in the abstract title (do not use in the abstract body)
- Use superscript or subscript (X², X₂) where appropriate e.g. FEV₁ (not FEV1)
- Capitalise acronyms e.g.:
 - Cystic Fibrosis Screen Positive Inconclusive Diagnosis (CFSPID)
 - Pancreatic Enzyme Replacement Therapy (PERT)
 - Lung Clearance Index (LCI)
 - MALDI-TOF

Use SI units	kg, ml, L	Kg, mL, l
Use a comma to describe numbers in the thousands	2,500 patients	2500 patients or 2.500 patients
Use a 0 before the decimal place	The dose was 0.5 g of DrugA.	The dose was .5 g of DrugA.

Do not use a space after an open bracket and before a closed bracket	(separate adult and paediatric centres)	(separate adult and paediatric centres)
Do not capitalise generic drug names unless the name is at the beginning of a sentence	Patient A was given paracetamol Paracetamol was given to Patient A.	Patient A was given Paracetamol
Use a slash when referring to modulator combinations	lumacaftor/ivacaftor	lumacaftor+ivacaftor
Use numerals instead of words if the number is anything higher than nine <u>except</u> at the beginning of a sentence	Patients were treated for 11 days. Study duration was 24 months. Twelve patients had headaches.	Patients were treated for eleven days. Study duration was twenty-four months. 12 patients had headaches.

Microorganisms Guidelines



First use All italicised and genus capitalised	Second use First letter of genus (in capitals) dot species (in italics)
Pseudomonas aeruginosa	<i>P. aeruginosa</i> or Pa
Mycobacterium abscessus	<i>M. abscessus</i> or MABSC
Staphylococcus aureus	S. aureus or Sa
Burkholderia cenocepacia (or Burkholderia cepacia, or Burkholderia)	<i>B. cepacia</i> or Bcc

CFTR or <i>CFTR</i> ?	Italicise CFTR when in these combinations	Do not italicise CFTR when in these combinations
CFTR is the name of a gene and also the name of the protein coded by the gene. The CFTR gene is italicised and the CFTR protein is not.	CFTR gene CFTR mutation CFTR mutations Mutations in CFTR CFTR genotype CFTR genotyping CFTR expression	CFTR protein CFTR channel CFTR is a protein CFTR function CFTR functionality CFTR activity
