


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CF care in the Middle East-Experiences of a recent conference visit




Topics (1) Standards of care

Conclusions



- Not many CF centres established yet
- Especially not many nurses available
- Lack of governmental financial support
- Lack of availibility of CF medication
- Long distance home clinic: patients don't come
- Large families e.g. 10 children and 5 having CF
- Life expectancy < 7 years
