
Adherence to anti-rejection medication after lungtransplantation



Patients

- 260 Patients
- 168 patients from Stockholm County 99 adults
 69 children
- 92 patients from northern and eastern Sweden
 60 adults
 - 32 children

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Transplantation

- Lund and Gothenburg: transplantation centers.
- In Sweden 96 CF patients lung transplanted between 1990-2013.
- 36 CF patients lung transplanted between
 1991 2013 (Stockholm CF center).
- 15 lung transplanted patients are followed at our center.

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Background

- During the past three years 4 CF patients have died from chronic rejection.
- It is known that if the patients do not follow their anti- rejection treatment, the risk for rejection increases.

Background

How to evaluate adherence?

- Medicine concentration
- Patient records
- Patient surveys

Aim of study

 To verify the adherence of lung transplanted patients to medication, and whether we as nurses can increase the adherence of the patients, by using a questionnaire called Transplant 360.

Patients

 14 lung transplanted patients mean age 39 years (range 19-53)

• 8 males and 6 females.



Lack of adherence to anti-rejection medication

- Taking
- Timing
- Dosing
- Skipping/ drug holiday



Method

The Transplant 360 questionnaires, used in nursing consultation

- BAASIS (Basel Assessment of Adherence scale for Immunosuppressive).
- TAQ (Transplant Adherence Questionnaire).
- IMAB (Identifying Medication Adherence Barriers).

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Questionnaire

• BAASIS and TAQ face-to face interview.

• IMAB is a self report questionnaire.

Frequency of patients visits

Outpatients clinic

• 1-2 visits/weekly up to three 3 months

• 2 visits/month up to 6 month

• Once monthly after 6 month





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Adherence taking, timing and dosage






Non adherence in taking medication






Non adherence in taking medication

Most frequent barriers


• Forgetfulness

Conclusion

- Using Transplant 360 has increased the patients adherence to medication and timing.
- Nurses can have a significant role in the patients improved adherence.



Patient's experience

- " I am forced to think differently since the questions made me become more aware of how I handled myself in the past month".
- *"I felt that together <u>we</u> could improve my values. It was not me against the healthcare".*



Reflection

- Through careful and systematic issues, it seems we get more reliable answers.
- Will we get the same results if we continue with the same issues? Is there a risk that patients begin to respond automatically without thinking.
- It is important to give the information in a language and in a way the patient understand.
