## Annual report from Austria 2018-2019

There are 16 CF centers in Austria, caring for approx. 800 CF patients in in- and outpatient settings in multidisciplinary teams. In addition, there are 2 centers for rehabilitation specialized in CF. The group of CF-physiotherapists includes approx. 50 members. There is at least one annual meeting of the group and additionally meetings of the Austrian group of cardiorespiratory physiotherapists within the framework of the Austrian Society of Pneumology. Recently, we integrated CF-physiotherapists who are not specialized in pneumology but working with CF patients (mostly from small centers), in this group, with the aim to increase nationwide quality standards in the daily treatment routine with CF patients. The group actively contributes with lectures and symposia to the annual conference of the Austrian Society of Pneumology as well as to international CF meetings. There are also several advanced training courses to teach and train colleagues, patients and their relatives.

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# Annual report from Czech Republic 2018-2019

There are currently 6 centres for patients with cystic fibrosis (Prague, Brno, Plzeň, Hradec Králové, Olomouc, Ostrava) with 645 patients in total (330 children, 315 adults). Around 25 respiratory physiotherapists take care of them. The number of patients for one physiotherapist differs from 2 to 50 (based on the size and area of the centre). Education of the therapist

- A possibility of visiting special training courses focused on respiratory physiotherapy
- A conference called RECYF held once a year in Prague
  - Meeting of pneumologists, physiotherapists, psychologists, nutrition therapists, nurses and other experts dealing with patients with CF
  - Experts from the Czech Republic, who visited ECFS conference during that year, speak about the latest topics
- Discussion about patients between physiotherapists is possible via email contact, supervision and during internships
   Education of the patients, parents
- Educational week after setting the diagnoses from the newborn screening parents and their baby are admitted to the hospital for three days (inhalation, airway clearance physiotherapy training)
- Outpatient controls 2-10 times/year according to needs and skills of the patient/parent
- Inpatient controls if it's needed
- Once a year CF meeting for families/friends/relations of patients expert lectures about physiotherapy (various topics) and other fields
   Projects
- We have already finished a project (pilot study) dealing with the effect of the reflex zone stimulation technique on lung functions in patients with cystic fibrosis
- Some of our centres have started to use Simeox device as a supportive device for airway clearance
- During April 2019 the first version of CF HERO App was activated
  - CF HERO APP helps teenagers with CF have better control over the inhalation process and respiratory physiotherapy in entertaining form

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# Annual report from United Kingdom 2018-2019

Association of Chartered Physiotherapists in CF (ACPCF) continues to be a well-supported and active group. There are currently 240 members representing 29 adult CF centers and 41 paediatric centers (specialist and associated shared care). There are 8 regional groups in England and 1 each for Scotland, Wales and Ireland (the Northern Ireland and Ireland groups have merged this year). These groups meet throughout the year and information is communicated to and from the committee via regional representatives.

The ACPCF continues to hold an annual study event, which takes place over 2 days each January. In 2019 there was a record attendance of 120 members and the programme included presentations on topics including anatomy and physiology of upper airways, a problem solving approach to airway clearance, interpretation of CPET and putting results

into practice, exercise and nutritional considerations in CF, an update on new therapies and feedback from various 2018 CF conferences.
