Annual report from Australia 2014-2015

The Australian Chapter of the IPG/CF continues to be active in research, conference presentations, higher degrees and professional growth. A number of our group attended the European CF Conference in Brussels. Anna Middleton and Brenda Button presented in the pre-conference course on musculoskeletal problems in CF and musculoskeletal screening as part of annual reviews. Ruth Dentice and Mark Elkins debated whether or not patients with mild lung disease should be prescribed airway clearance therapy from the time of diagnosis. This session was interesting, innovatively presented and highly entertaining.

The bi-ennial Australia and New Zealand Conference was held in Sydney in August, 2015. The Sydney based organizing committee put together an excellent physiotherapy program. The pre-conference day on exercise was well attended and covered a wide range of topics. Professor Anne Holland launched the updated "Physiotherapy for CF in Australia Guidelines" which was endorsed by the TSANZ in August, 2015. Thirty-seven physiotherapists with a special interest in CF made up the writing group. They undertook the literature search and updated the consensus guidelines. Professor Eleanor Main was the invited speaker and gave a number of interesting presentations on modern physiotherapy and changes that have occurred in recent years. She challenged physiotherapists about useful study designs and appropriate outcome measures for future clinical trials in physiotherapy where randomized double blind placebo controlled trials are not possible. Many physiotherapists from around Australia presented their clinical research. Brenda Button presented the results of her Winston Churchill Fellowship where she visited hospitals in Belgium, Germany, France, the USA and Canada investigating state of the art physiotherapy for patients with lung disease treated with awake and ambulatory ECMO while being bridged to lung transplant.

Professor Anne Holland was awarded a full professorship at La Trobe University. She was also elected to the Board of the TSANZ and served this year on the NHMRC Grants Selection Panel. She was successful in obtaining an NHMRC grant to study the use of telehealth in pulmonary rehabilitation, the subject of her Winston Churchill Fellowship undertaken in 2009.

An advanced airway clearance course is being planned by Jamie Wood and Brenda Button during the last two week-ends in November, 2016, one in Perth and the other in Melbourne. We are so pleased Filip van Ginderdeuren from Brussels has agreed to travel to Australia and to present at the two day course. The annual basic airway clearance course will be held at the Alfred in Melbourne in April, 2016.

2015 was a busy year with many physiotherapy achievements in Australia and we look forward to an equally productive 2016.

Annual report from Sweden 2014-2015

There are 4 centers with totally 650 patients with CF in Sweden, of whom around 225 are children. We almost cover the recommendations according to the Consensus, with one physiotherapist/50 patients The last two years there have been works done at all centers with two big projects: The first is "Our future"

1. The goal has been to involve the young patients (8-16 yrs) more in the treatment of their disease. Staff members and the patients have met through video conferences, where we e.g. have listened to each other, discussed the disease, treatment, future

The second is "Genia"

2. The next project has been to introduce and evaluate the App "Genia", which is created by a father to a patient. The goal with this App is to give the patients a better control over the disease, day by day and to have an easy way to submit data to a register ahead of a visit to the clinic.

There have been some other activities as well going on

- Some of the physiotherapists visited the ECFS and the NACFS conferences, both with and without own presentations. At the NACFS conference the App Genia was presented as a poster.
- Within the country there have been education opportunities for patients and parents at the centers
- One recreational week in Mallorca for teenagers was arranged with two physiotherapists supporting during inhalation, ACT, physical exercise and education
- Through IPG one physiotherapist has been in Bosnia educating patients and relatives in CF treatment.
- Physiotherapist Cecilia Rodrigues Hortal is a Phd student with studies in Noninvasive ventilation. The last study has just started.
- In September colleges in Aarhus Denmark hosted a Nordic conference during two days for physiotherapist working with CF, 26 attended. The program covered different areas such as CPET testing on ergometer with a patient followed by discussions, treatment of urinary incontinence in children, nasal rinse, treatment differences and similarities in our countries.

A note to all from Margareta:

I have just retired from my work at Gothenburg CF center where I have been 21 yrs, celebrated 67 yrs last September. I'm continuing with some research.
