Please look out in future newsletters as we may ask for comments, suggestions or speakers.




Q1 Which patient group do you currently work with?


Q2 Are you a country contact person?




Q3 If you could pick one area for the IPG/CF to focus on in 2016, what would it be?




Q4 How would you rate the importance of the following IPG/CF research activities?




Q5 How would you rate the importance of the following IPG/CF education activities?


Q9 If there was help available in writing an abstract or case presentation from the IPG would you use this service?


Q9 If there was help available in writing an abstract or case presentation from the IPG would you use this service?



IPGCF June 2015-June 2016 ANNUAL REPORTS FOR MEMBER COUNTRIES

Annual report from Argentina 2015-2016

In Buenos Aires there are four main centres with 631 patients. Three of these, are paediatric centres with 11% of patients younger than two years. There is one adult centre with 91 patients. Most centres have one or two physiotherapists involved with care of both in and outpatients. There are 30 patients who have been transferred to adult centres, there are also 10 patients who have been successfully transplanted. Pulmonary Rehabilitation is performed in two paediatric hospitals and in the third one a Reconditioning Exercise Programme.

Related to *education*, during 2015 there were 4 multicentre meetings. Since 2011 there is an Argentine Association of CF, which organize a Meeting every two years, where Physiotherapist lectures usually take place. In the last 2015 Congress more than 70 physiotherapists had participated and there were different workshops for physiotherapists and parents. The next national conference will be held in April 2017.

Different types of courses are given, for parents with small babies, for colleagues in all the country's province's, and similarly in neighbouring countries like Peru. In the same manner there are conferences and training for university students in our hospital.

Our *plan* is to try improve the contact with the rest of the physiotherapists who work with cystic fibrosis patients in the rest of our country and to continue teaching parents.

Annual report from Austria 2015-2016

In Austria there are presently 15 CF-centres, which care for around 850 CF-patients. More than 50% of the patients are already adults, however, there are still only 5 designated adult centres, 3 of the 10 paediatric centres also care for adult patients so far. An increasing number of people with CF had an organ transplantation, most of them received lungs, a few received liver, kidney or a combination of two organs. The majority of transplantations are performed in one of two transplantation centres and most of the patients receive their further CF-care within the multidisciplinary setting of these centres.

In Austria the CF-centres are incorporated in pulmonary departments, therefore the 30 - 35 physiotherapists treating CF-patients also care for patients with other respiratory diseases. Hence the PT-working group of the Austrian Society of Pneumology is home for all physiotherapists dealing with cardiorespiratory patients in the paediatric, adult, surgical, intensive care, as well as rehabilitative setting. The group is usually very active in raising the general standard of cardiorespiratory physiotherapy in Austria.

During the recent year the activities have been somewhat more modest, members of the group:

- Participated in a CF-experts meeting
- Contributed actively with lectures to the programme of the experts meeting, the Annual Conference of the Austrian Society of Pneumology and the Annual Meeting of the CF-lay group
- Promoted specific hygiene guidelines for CF-physiotherapy treatment situations
- Beyond the scientific contributions, the specialised physiotherapists were again very active in teaching and training less experienced physiotherapists in all aspects of CF

Annual report from Germany 2015-2016

The German CF working group consists of about 170 members at this moment. Our annual meeting takes place once a year in November at the National Cystic Fibrosis Meeting.

Out of this group an executive board comprising 5 members is elected every 3 years. The next elections will take place at this year's annual meeting.

In this year 5 courses to qualify physiotherapists in airway clearance techniques for patients with CF an other chronic pulmonary diseases were again held in different cities in Germany.

Additionally, one advanced course (one week at a rehabilitation centre for CF patients) took place in 2015 in Tannheim/ Schwarzwald and will be repeated in October 2016 at the clinic "Satteldüne" on the island of Amrum.

On 16th of April 2016 a one day symposium on "New Developments in Inhalation Therapy" was realized in Köln. About 60 Physiotherapists and other CF professionals attended the event. This symposium was already realised in September 2014 in Berlin and due to the great response repeated this year. Jovita Zerli

Annual report from Greece 2015-2016

In cooperation with the Association for Cystic Fibrosis we organised a two day course titled "Physiotherapy in Cystic Fibrosis" in Thessaloniki, 8-9th February 2016. The course instructors were Dr. Louise Lannefors and Dr. Sarah Payne, both official instructors of the IPG/CF. Thessaloniki is in northern Greece, so we took the opportunity to invite physiotherapists from FYROM and Serbia to attend the course. Annual report from Israel 2015-2016

There are about 680 people diagnosed with cystic fibrosis (CF) in Israel.

There are seven CF centers with about 120 members of the multidisciplinary team, including 11 physiotherapists. One transplantation center at Rabin medical center – Belinson.

There are about 200 physiotherapists and physiotherapy students who treat the patients in their home. There are more than 800 physiotherapists and physiotherapy students registered in the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation of Israel (CFFI).

Since 2013 all the CF patients are entitled to receive a monthly refund for the physiotherapy treatments at home from the Health care services, up to $20 \in$ per day.

The CFFI is responsible for and manages several projects:

Manage the database therapists, physiotherapists and physiotherapy students who are willing to treat CF patients at home.

Therapists annual conference – learning about the treatment and enhance knowledge about respiratory techniques and other treatments, such as musculoskeletal and pelvic floor treatments for CF patients.

Yearly recruiting of therapists from all classes of physiotherapy in the country.

Financial assistance to patients.

Free subscriptions to gyms for patients, surfing classes, and more sports activity.

Annual report from Italy 2015-2016

MEMBERSHIP: Italian Physiotherapy Group for CF is formed by Sara Tomezzoli (president), Anna Brivio (secretary) and me (contact person in IPG/CF); in November 2016 new members election will take place and one of our group a physiotherapists will be involved in the membership of Italian Cystic Fibrosis Society's (SIFC) board.

Our group is composed by junior and senior physiotherapists from many Italian CF Centres; our mailing list counts over an hundred contacts for communications.

Our group is part of SIFC and the society organizes an annual meeting course and a conference; participation our group's activities requires an annual fee for membership.

Some physiotherapists are also members of ARIR (Associazione Riabilitatori dell'Insufficienza Respiratoria).

ACTIVITIES IN THE LAST YEAR (2015):

- Some members of the group created multicenter studies in the field of exercise (one about habitual physichal acitivity and exercise performance in CF adolescents and another about 6 minutes walking test in CF children);
- a multidisciplinary group of expert CF physiotherapists has been built to create internal guidelines on exercise and training in CF children, adolescents, adults and patients after lung transplantation, in order to uniform activities in the different Centres;
- a physiotherapist from each Italian CF Centre attended to a course about autogenic drainage with Jean Chevaillier.

ACTIVITIES FOR THIS YEAR (2016):

- to participate in the European CF Conference in Basel with poster presentations;
- to translate and publish in a scientific journal the "Core Competence of CF Italian Physiotherapist" written by a group of senior CF physiotherapists;
- to build a group of expert CF and lung transplantation physiotherapists aiming to standardize the treatment of patients with CF before and after lung transplantation and drawing up some guidelines for pulmonary rehabilitation in these patients;
- to analyze data and publish the results of the multicenter study about habitual physichal acitivity and exercise performance in CF adolescents;
- to start the new multicenter study about 6MWT in CF children.

Annual report from Poland 2015-2016

In Poland there are 4 main pediatric CF-centers and 11 district centers. There are also 3 adult CF-centers, it is not enough taking into account the growing number of adult patients. All the centers take care of a total of 1725 CF patients, of which 715 are adults patients. In Poland there are presently 2 lung transplantation centers for CF patients. The new center was established three years ago in Szczecin, and a year ago in the polish famous cardio-pulmonary transplantation center in Zabrze created a separate branch only for patients with CF.

At present the group of twenty physiotherapists from main cystic fibrosis centers is active within Polish Cystic Fibrosis Society which unite together representatives of all professions involved in the cystic fibrosis. As usually they participated actively in Society Conference held in May in Ossa near Warsaw. As well the physiotherapists were actively involved in the Annual Conference for patients with CF and their parents organized by MATIO Foundation and in the Annual Meeting of Polish Society Against Cystic. The practice physiotherapy workshops for patients and parents was organized during this conferences.

In Poland, unfortunately, there is no home physiotherapy for CF patients and so far there is no possibility solution to this problem of a systemic. However, this year there is the possibility of financing a home physiotherapy from other sources. 20 physiotherapists have already been trained in this realm.

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Annual report from Sweden 2015-2016

There are 4 centers with totally 660 patients with CF in Sweden, of whom around 245 are children. 1) Projects:

- "Our future": To get involved the young patients (8-16 yrs) more in the treatment of their disease. Staff members and the patients have met through video conferences (via Skype), where have listened and discussed the disease, treatment, and future.

"Genia": The next project has been the App "Genia". The goal with this App is to give the patients a better control over the disease, and to have an easy way to submit data to a register ahead of a visit to the clinic. The last update is a new function called: "Under the meeting " where we, together with the patient summarized what we have dicussed during the meeting.

- 2) Education:
- Within the country there have been education opportunities for patients and parents at the centers.
- National educational days for the staff members at Stockholm and Jönköping 2015.
- National meeting or video conference (once a month) where physiotherapist working with children discuss about different topics.
- One recreational week in Mallorca for teenagers was arranged with two physiotherapists.
- Magister about non invasive ventilation in CF (Charlotte Wallman Jansson).
- New publication: "Non-invasive Ventilation as Airway Clearance Technique in Cystic Fibrosis" Physiotherapy research international 2016. (Rodriguez Hortal et al).
- 3) Conference:
- Some of the physiotherapists attended the ECFS Basel 2015 and the NACFS Phoenix 2015 conferences, both with and without own presentations.
- Some of the physiotherapist attended the ERS-course in Prague 2015, Czech Republic "Basics in CF".
- Nordic meeting in Aarhus Denmark for physiotherapist working with CF. CPET testing on ergometer with a patient followed by discussions, treatment of urinary incontinence in children, nasal rinse, treatment differences and similarities in our countries.

Annual report from Switzerland 2015-2016

In Switzerland we have currently 12 CF centers, which look after approx. 1000 CF patients. The majority of the patients receive CF care within the multidisciplinary setting of these centers.

The Swiss Working Group for cystic fibrosis (SWGCF) is an association of physicians, therapists and scientists taking care of CF patients while being involved with scientific projects or while otherwise professionally engaged with the CF disease.

The Physiotherapy Working Group (cf-physio.ch) on the other hand provides professional information and education about physiotherapy treatment methods to both CF patients as well as health care professionals with the aim to ensure excellence in CF care to improve quality of life.
