4. Annual reports

Annual National Report 2020/21 from Austria

There are 16 CF centers in Austria, caring for approx. 800 CF patients in in- and outpatient settings in multidisciplinary teams. In addition, there are 2 centers for rehabilitation specialized in CF. The group of CF-physiotherapists includes approx. 50 members.

There is at least one annual meeting of the group and additionally meetings of the Austrian group of cardiorespiratory physiotherapists within the framework of the Austrian Society of Pneumology. Recently, we integrated CF-physiotherapists who are not specialized in pneumology but working with CF patients (mostly from small centers), in this group, with the aim to increase nationwide quality standards in the daily treatment routine with CF patients. The group actively contributes with lectures and symposia to the annual conference of the Austrian Society of Pneumology as well as to international CF meetings. There are also several advanced training courses to teach and train colleagues, patients and their relatives.

Annual National Report 2020/21 from Brazil

The last available edition of the CF Brazilian registry (2018) shows that 5417 patients were registered and followed at 51 different reference centers across the country. It is estimated that approximately 150 physiotherapists are directly working in CF units (CF centers and hospitals). Recent activities:

- Publication of the Brazilian guidelines for physiotherapy management of CF patients (Brazilian Recommendations on Physiotherapy in Cystic Fibrosis: A Guide to Clinical Practice ASSOBRAFIR CIENCIA. 2019;10(1):1-188).
- Article presenting a national survey on most recommended physiotherapy techniques for patients with CF (Donadio MVF, Campos NE, Vendrusculo FM, et al. Respiratory physical therapy techniques recommended for patients with cystic fibrosis treated in specialized centers. Braz J Phys Ther. 2020;24(6):532-538).
- Upcoming events: VIII Brazilian Multidisciplinary CF Conference 2022.

Annual National Report 2020/2021 from the Czech Republic

There are currently 5 centres for patients with cystic fibrosis, caring for 684 patients in total (339 children, 345 adults). During the last 12 months we have diagnosed 24 new patients. Around 25 respiratory physiotherapists take care of CF patients, either on a full or a part time basis. The number of patients for one physiotherapist differs from 2 to 50 (based on the size and location of the centre).

INTERNATIONAL PHYSIOTHERAPY GROUP FOR CYSTIC FIBROSIS

The Czech conference called RECYF, where pulmonologists, physiotherapists, psychologists, nutrition therapists, nurses and other experts participated, was hosted online this year due to the COVID pandemic. The accompanying course for physiotherapists has been rescheduled for autumn 2021. The annual CF meeting for families/friends/relatives of patients was also performed using a digital platform, with the expert physiotherapy lecture focusing on coughing, and how to manage this problematic area. Recent activities:

With the support of the Czech CF Foundation, educational videos were made for children and adult CF patients. The videos focused on airway clearance techniques of upper and lower airways and inhalation.

Annual National Report 2020/21 from France

So as every year our French Physio group for cf has organized courses for Physio, courses for patient, courses for parents. Everywhere in the country with the French association support

our group has réalised videos about ACT and instrumental aids and développed teleconsulting because of Covid period. Sophie Jacques became president of our group. She was working since 20 years in a private activity in Rennes for cf rehabilitation. Our project: All the Physiotherapist who are working in cf reference center will have been trained in autogene drainage with Hugues gauchez and his team. No courses that year in east countries of Europe but where are very enjoy to be able to do it in July 2021.

Annual National Report 2020/21 from Germany

The German CF working group consists of about 170 members at this moment. Our annual meeting takes place once a year in November at the National Cystic Fibrosis Meeting.

Out of this group an executive board comprising 5 members is elected every 3 years.

In this year 5 courses to qualify physiotherapists in airway clearance techniques for patients with CF and other chronic pulmonary diseases were realized.

Due to the restrictions of the Covid 19 pandemic all activities such as airway clearance courses for physiotherapists, programs for patients and parents and all annual meetings could only be realized in a digital way.

Annual National Report 2020/21 from Ireland

There are approximately 40 Irish physiotherapists working in Cystic Fibrosis (CF), either on a full or a part time basis. (Some of these physiotherapists work in Northern Ireland, and are part of the NHS, so do not work with the patients mentioned below).

The most recent registry data reports that there are 746 adults and 508 children living with CF, and receiving care in the Republic of Ireland. The largest centre, which is situated in Dublin, provides care for almost 400 adults with CF, several other centres throughout the country provide care for the remaining adults with CF. Children's Hospital Ireland (CHI) provide paediatric care in conjunction with several regional centres. Over the last year, the Irish physiotherapy group has attended the ACPCF conference, and had a focus on developing and providing virtual care where appropriate.

Planned activities for the Irish physio group for the coming year include running a study day, attending the ACPCF conference, and continuing with current research and service development projects within the various centres.

Annual National Report 2020/21 from Israel

There are about 700 people diagnosed with cystic fibrosis (CF) in Israel.

There are seven CF centers and one center only for adults, with about 130 members of the multidisciplinary team, including 13 physiotherapists. Two transplantation centers at Rabin medical center, and Sheba Hospital.

INTERNATIONAL PHYSIOTHERAPY GROUP FOR CYSTIC FIBROSIS

There are about 300 physiotherapists and physiotherapy students who treat the patients in their home. There are more than 600 physiotherapists and physiotherapy students registered in the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation of Israel (CFFI).

Since 2013 all the CF patients are entitled to receive a monthly refund for the physiotherapy treatments at home from the Health care services, up to 25 € per day.

The CFFI is responsible for and manages several projects:

Manage the database therapists, physiotherapists and physiotherapy students who are willing to treat CF patients at home.

Therapists annual conference – learning about the treatment and enhance knowledge about respiratory techniques and other treatments, such as musculoskeletal exercises and pelvic floor treatments for CF patients.

Yearly recruiting of therapists from all classes of physiotherapy in the country.

Financial assistance to patients.

Free subscriptions to gyms for patients, surfing classes, and more sports activity.

Annual National Report 2020/21 from Norway

There are about 402 persons with CF in Norway (children 134, adults 268). Norway has Newborn screening since 2012 and CF Patient Registry since 2016. The National working group consist of 19 Physiotherapists working with children and/or adults with CF at CF-centre/in the specialist health care. According to the Norwegian working model, CF-centre's Physiotherapists establish/adjust treatment and mainly collaborates with Physiotherapists in the primary health services on follow-up. Adolescents and adults mainly perform established/adjusted self-treatment at home.

Main activities in the group/for participants in the group have been:

- Digital meetings with Physiotherapists in regional hospitals/primary health service regarding individual patients. Video/telephone consultations with adults
- Participation on ECFC digital 2020
- National and International Webinars
- Interdisciplinary digital course for families with newly diagnosed children after NBS
- Infection control: Routines for Physiotherapy during Covid-19
- National contact person IPG/CF related work: Annual general meeting 2020, IPG/CF Questionnaire review

Annual National Report 2020/21 from Slovak Republic

This year there have been organizational changes in ambulances and hospitals, which led to limitations on physiotherapy. We have created educational videos for use in a mobile application with CF Foundation. More media appearances have been arranged, which contributed to the result that Simeox is now covered by the mandatory public health insurance from the age of 8 years. 3-6 June, 2021 3rd International Meeting of Physiotherapists organized by the Association of Cystic Fibrosis and delivered by Lecturers Doc. PaedDr. Libuse Smolikova (CZ) and Petra Kolcunova (SR).
