The healthcare personnel has to assume that **ALL** people with CF have pathogens in respiratory tract secretions that are transmissible to other people with CF

Core recommendations

- Most core recommendations = local IPC guidelines
 - Local I,P&C made procedures about hospital hygiene, isolation, hand hygiene, renovation
 - Colaboration with institutional IP&C teams (next 14/7/2015)



Core recommendations

- Hand hygiene
 - Availability of alcohol-based hand rub and neutral soap and water:
 - Use before and after direct contact with patient, wearing gloves, entering and leaving the patient room, ...
 - Artificial fingernails, nail extenders and nail polish are prohibited
 - Wearing rings and watches is prohibited



- Sputum or cough swab at least every 3 months
- Identification , specification and molecular typing if needed:
 - Burkholderia spp
 - Pseudomonas
 - Alcaligenes
- NTM once a year

 - More space




Inpatient settings

- Isolation precautions
 - CF-patients: single room
 - Adequate space for personal protective equipment
 - Mask when taking cough swab and sputum
 - Lab coat
 - Negative Pressure Room

Inpatient settings

- House rules
 - Immediately to own room
 - Leaving the room only with surgical mask
 - Use of own nebuliser or Pari Central Air system
 - Electric steam sterilizer for 15 minutes
 - Alcohol 70%

- Do the CF-patients have to wear a **mask** when they put the first step in the hospital ?
- Do we , as care givers , have to wear an **eye-protection** when taking a sputum or a cough swab ?
- Do we have to change the **gown** every time we see another patient ?
