Gerd Döring Award – Call for nominations

CVs will make a 20% contribution to the scoring.

The Gerd Döring Award is an initiative of the ECFS and is given annually to honour an exceptional young European scientist in their early career. The Award consists of a monetary donation of 5,000 euro to support research.

The award will be judged primarily on a paper published in the previous 3 calendar years (2020-2022) which has made a significant impact on the understanding or treatment of cystic fibrosis. Personal statements and

The award is open to PhD students and post-doctoral researchers with up to a maximum of four years' academic research experience following the completion of their PhD, or be of equivalent professional standing at the date of publication of the paper.

We encourage mentors, supervisors and co-workers of today's most exceptional early career European scientists to send in nominations for this award. The deadline for proposals is 7 March 2023. Psychosocial/Mental Health pre-conference course

Psychodynamic aspects in chronic, medical illness.

Tuesday 6 June – 0.5 Day

The ECFS Conference this year takes place in Vienna, the city of Freud. This gives a great opportunity to explore how the psychodynamic aspects could be used in work with patients with cystic fibrosis.



Clinical Nutrition Course

Mastering new clinical expertise in emerging nutritional areas.

Tuesday 6 June – 0.5 Day

This course will aim to provide education and real world experience in the emerging clinical skills now required by the CF dietitian. The latest literature will be summarised and practical skills examined and discussed.



Physiotherapy Short Course

Exercise testing – practicalities and applications for clinical practice

Tuesday 6 and Wednesday 7 June – 1.5 Day

This course has been designed to give an overview of the practicalities of exercise testing, including CPET and submaximal tests. Discussions around suitability of different tests and interpretation of test data for clinical practice are included alongside talks on factors which influence exercise ability and participation and exercise for airway clearance. The course includes an expert panel discussion about selected clinical cases and participants are invited to submit potential cases for discussion.

All ECFS members can access the Education platform with their credentials (see below).

Part 2: 'More about CF' builds upon the first part and is now in the final stages of development with plan for UEMS EACCME accreditation in the coming months and release on the ECFS Education platform in the Summer.

The last Part, Part 3: 'Becoming a CF clinical expert: How to manage...' will focus on management of specific clinical situations. Work on this last part will begin soon.

Practical guide on how to access the ECFS Education platform and the ECFS e-learning programme: Log into your ECFS account.


Via MY ECFS, click on the education platform icon; or go to the education homepage (<u>www.ecfs.eu/education</u>) and click on either of the education platform buttons.



Once on the ECFS Education Platform home page, click on 'ECFS courses, conferences and meetings': you will have access to a wealth of educational resources such as ECFS courses and webcasts from previous ECFS conferences (pre-conference courses, plenaries, symposia).



To access the e-learning programme, select the 'ECFS e-learning programme on CF' and click on 'Start' to commence the course!

In memoriam Professor John Dodge, CBE, FRCP, FRCPE, FRCPI, FRCPCH



John Ashton Dodge was born in Cardiff, in 1933. After junior posts he decided on a career in Paediatrics and spent 2 years in Children's Hospital, Boston, USA and Harvard Medical School 1961-63.

In 1964 John was appointed as Lecturer in Child Health at Queen's University, Belfast, and at the Royal Belfast Hospital for Sick Children. He established a CF clinic serving Northern Ireland and joined relevant European and International organisations. Returning to Cardiff in 1971 he set up the first CF and paediatric gastroenterology clinics in Wales, with outreach clinics in other parts of the Principality.

His research activity included epidemiology, neonatal screening, delivery of health care for children, impact of life events on children, psychosomatic disorders, energy balance in CF.

In 1985 he was invited back to the Nuffield Chair of Child Health in Belfast, as Head of Department where his clinical and research activity continued. By then he was a frequent examiner at universities in the UK and abroad, committee member, secretary or chairman of various organisations. He was a faithful ECFS member, actively involved in many ECFS activities and groups. From 1988-2011, he was an Adviser in Human Genetics to WHO and chaired a series of Expert meetings on Cystic Fibrosis which were published with appropriate recommendations. After his retirement in 1997, he became Emeritus Professor of Child Health at the Queen's University, Belfast, and Honorary Professor of Child Health at the University of Wales at Swansea.

Although no longer seeing patients he continued to be active in research, publishing, reviewing papers and projects, some teaching, and speaking at conferences and elsewhere.
